### Note

The following Table provides traffic trend information derived from a small sample set of traffic counters located on the national road network.

The information below covers the morning period from 7am until 10am. The trend for car traffic from this period of the day generally correlates closely with the overall daily trend in car traffic at each location.

## **Introductory Remarks**

- ➤ In the initial three weeks following the introduction of the March 27<sup>th</sup> restrictions, traffic volumes were very consistent. Overall traffic volumes were typically down approximately 65-70% across the national road network.
- From Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> April, an upward trend in car traffic volumes became apparent.
- ➤ In response, daily traffic figures are being provided in order to more closely monitor the trends. Traffic figures are measured from 7am to 10am so as to provide an early indicator each day.
- ➤ Weekly heavy goods vehicle traffic has remained largely stable and accordingly the daily figures provided are for cars only.
- ➤ The changes day-to-day are not cumulative they compare only the current day's figures versus the same day in the previous week and the same day last year.

# Daily Data for Monday 29th June

- ➤ Car traffic volumes today at the sample counters show significantly stronger growth as compared with Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June than the growth rates experienced last week.
- ➤ Overall, car traffic today is typically down by between 26% and 37% of the volumes of one year ago, across the sampled traffic counters.
- ➤ Car traffic just south of the Northern Ireland Border on the N1 at Jonesboro is up 16% today as compared with Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. The overall reduction in car traffic at this counter is now 37% and the car traffic reduction at this counter is now very much consistent with the car traffic reduction figures experienced at the other sample counters.
- ➤ Car traffic volumes on the radial routes into Dublin show an increase this morning as compared with Monday of last week of between 7% and 18%. Car traffic is up 18% on the M11 at Bray, 11% on the N7 at Citywest, 9% on the M1 at Swords to Airport and 7% on the M4 at Celbridge-Maynooth,. These growth figures are significantly higher than the growth levels experienced last week.
- ➤ The M50 (N3 Navan Road to N4 Galway Road) shows a 9% increase as compared with Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. This is consistent with the growth rates recorded today on the radial approach routes, apart from the M11 counter which experienced particularly high growth.
- ➤ In the case of the regional cities the increase in car traffic volumes this morning as compared with Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June is as follows: M9 Waterford 12%, M7 Limerick 11%, N40 Cork 11% and N6 Bóthar na dTreabh Galway 10%. These growth figures are significantly higher than last week's figures for the regional cities and broadly consistent with the level of growth experienced on the Dublin radial routes this morning.
- > Overall, today's growth figures are the strongest experienced for a number of weeks.
