Notice of proposed project pursuant to Regulation 42(13) of the European Union (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 (S.I. No. 477 of 2011)¹

I. The location, including the townland and county, to which the application relates

The project is proposed in the townland of Knockbrack East in County Kerry.

II. The nature and extent of the proposed project

The works to Knockbrack Culvert comprise the removal and reconstruction of the concrete apron and training walls between the culvert and the old disused bridge. Voids and cracks in the box culvert/downstream apron are to be repaired by means of cementitious grout and suitable repair concrete. The proposed works include:

- Existing riverbed apron (upstream of culvert) and training walls to be broken out and disposed of offsite. New cast in situ reinforced concrete apron to be constructed. At the request of Inland Fisheries Ireland, the apron will be constructed with a dish/deeper channel to the centre of the stream. This is to aid fish passage through the structure.
- Embankment behind existing training walls to be excavated and filled to allow for installation of new training walls.
- Once the upstream hardstand has been excavated the inlet to the box culvert is to be pumped
 with cementitious grout fill 3 no. pump locations located 1m from the first box section and
 1m between each pumping location.
- New apron to be cast in 3 separate sections each 5m in length. End sections to be poured first followed by the middle section.
- The base of each box unit shall be drilled through and injected with cementitious grout fill.
- Voids and cracking (downstream of culvert) to existing concrete apron to be repaired with suitable repair mortar.

Further details on the nature and extent of the proposed reactive maintenance works are contained within *TO 334 Munster Bridges Term Maintenance – Knockbrack Culvert – Natura Impact Statement* (Rev. 1, WS Atkins Ireland Limited, 19th of March 2024).

III. The possible decisions

Transport Infrastructure Ireland will determine pursuant to Regulation 42(11) of the European Union (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 (S.I. No. 477 of 2011) and Article 6(3) of the Habitats Directive as to whether or not the proposed reactive bridge maintenance works would adversely affect the integrity of a European site.
