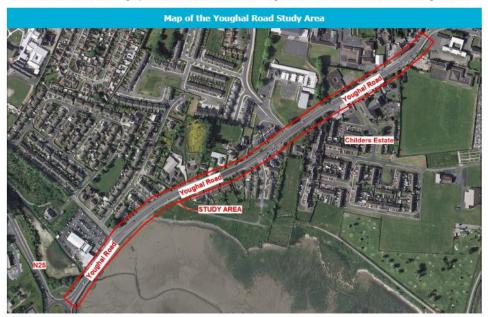
Go Dungarvan wants your views on the further development of the Youghal Road (Mitchell Street to the N25).

- 5. To decrease car mode share from 78% to 45% (factor of 0.69)

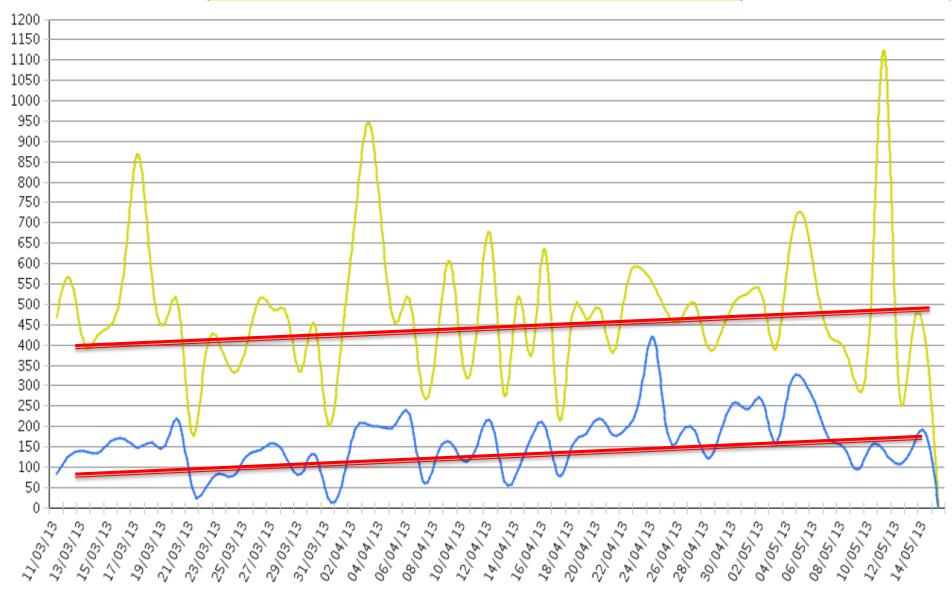

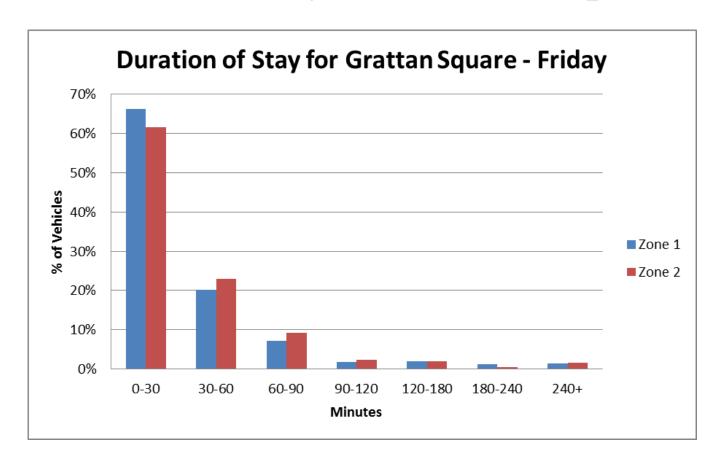

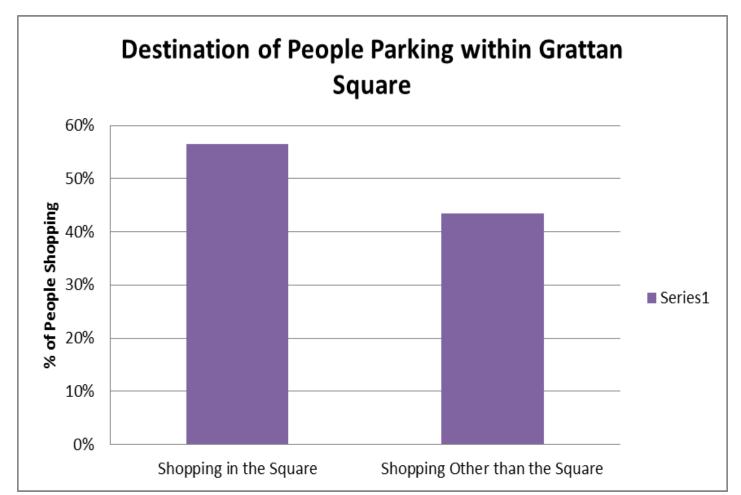

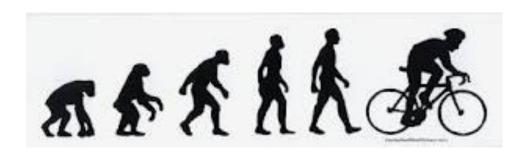


Hourly Pedestrian Crossing Volumes
