Further to recent meeting, please find short note on proposed Reactive Maintenance works at Castlereagh Bridge in Co. Galway – adopting the briefing email approach as discussed.

It is proposed to repair a section of damaged parapet wall at Castlereagh Bridge (x - 569785.6 / y - 771965.3) – see attached photographs. The bridge is not with an SAC or SPA. It is on a small stream, which is a tributary of the Island River, which it joins just above this river's confluence with the River Suck near the village of Ballymoe, Co. Galway (this is located just south of the Galway – Roscommon border / south of Castlerea, Co. Roscommon).

Castlereagh Bridge is within the EPA catchment - Suck_SC_020. It is located >15km upstream of the River Suck Callows SPA (004097). No freshwater pearl mussel are present. No invasive species noted at this location. Works area not suitable as roost site for bats. Not within a pNHA / NHA.

The damaged section is around 10m away from the water course that the bridge crosses – i.e. over the riverbank not the river. Stone would be salvaged from the area and reused in so far as is practical. Where needed additional stone, matching that on site, may be imported for use. The area will be cleared back, with any debris / vegetation removed. It will then be rebuilt using lime mortar (NHL5). There is no requirement for shuttering or use of liquid cement.

Further to our discussion of very small works only requiring an email to you to demonstrate that Appropriate Assessment has been considered – are you happy that works at this location fit this model and can be approved? Is this level of information sufficient for you to make a decision?
