

Re. SO-N04-001.30 / Caltragh Bridge [Reactive Maintenance]

Caltragh Bridge is over the N4 Regional road on the southern side of Sligo town; as shown below.



There is a gap in the safety barrier on the Caltragh Bridge overbridge on the N4. The proposal is to close the gap to protect pedestrian access and a fall from height and a drop to the ground below at the 4 No. corners of the bridge. The agreed detail, to close the unprotected gap is attached along with a couple of typical photographs showing the typical status quo at each of the 4 No. corners of the bridge. Caltragh Bridge is a two span structure that carries a local road over the N4 dual carriageway. The bridge is not over water. It is not within an SAC or an SPA. Cummeen Strand/Drumcliff Bay (Sligo Bay) SAC (000627) is 1.75km to the north; as is Cummeen Strand SPA (004035). Ballysadare Bay SAC (000622) is located 4.5km to the south; as is Ballysadare Bay SPA (004129). Proposed works will not impact these European sites either directly or indirectly.

As can be seen from the photos all work would be undertaken on the bridge deck in area which does not support semi-natural habitats or species of ecological value. The works areas are adjoined by amenity grassland and some shrubs – part of the motorway landscaping at the interchange. No invasive species have been recorded from this location. The works area is not suitable for supporting roosting bats.

## Atkins Findings -

This Screening for Appropriate Assessment is based on the best available scientific information. It is concluded that the proposed project poses no likely significant effects on Natura 2000 sites, either alone or in combination with other projects. Thus, it is recommended that it is not necessary for the proposed project to proceed to Appropriate Assessment.
