

# TII Child Safeguarding Statement

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# **Background**

The Children First Act 2015 requires organisations that are providers of 'relevant services' to publish a Child Safeguarding Statement (Schedule 1 of the Act provides a list of work or activities that constitute a 'relevant service').

This Statement details the relevant services provided by Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) and the principles and procedures in place to ensure, as far as practicable, that a child availing of these services is safe from harm. The Statement will be reviewed every two years or sooner if there has been a material change in any of the services to which it refers.

## **Relevant Services provided by TII**

In preparing this Child Safeguarding Statement, TII undertook a review of all services provided to identify those that fall under the definition of a relevant service as defined by the Children First Act 2015.

One service was identified, and a risk assessment was undertaken. This statement details the nature of the service, the principles and procedures in place to safeguard children from harm while availing of the service and the risk assessment.

The service identified was:

1. Transition Year / Young Persons Placement Programme

### **Transition Year / Young Persons Placement Programme**

TII provides a placement programme for Transition Year secondary school students and other <sup>1</sup>young persons on request. This service falls under the relevant service outlined in the Children First Act 2015, Schedule 1, 5(a):

Any work or activity which consists of the provision of educational, research, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities to children.

### Principles in place to safeguard children from harm

TII is committed to protecting and facilitating the full participation of young people on work experience. It aims to create a safe environment for young people on work experience, and is committed to ensuring their safety and welfare at all times in accordance with the following documents:

- Children First Act 2015
- Children First National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children (Department of Children and Youth Affairs, 2017)
- Our Duty to Care The Principles of Good Practice for the Protection of Children and Young People (Department of Health and Children, 2002).

# Obligations to safeguard children from harm

As the placement of Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons in TII is considered to be a relevant service to children under the Act the following obligations attach:

- a) To keep the child safe from harm while receiving the service [i.e. on the placement];
- b) To assess the risks; and
- c) To address those risks, as required by the Act, in TII's Child Safeguarding Statement.

### **Risk Assessment**

TII have carried out an assessment of any potential for harm<sup>2</sup> to a child while availing of this service. The risks identified are listed below, along with procedures in place for managing these risks.

Risk Identified	Procedures to mitigate Risks
Risk of harm to the young person in the course of their placement	<ul> <li>i) A relevant member of the department to which the Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons are assigned will have completed the Children First eLearning training provided by TUSLA.</li> </ul>
	ii) HR, in advance of the placement, will distribute the TII Child Safeguarding Statement to all staff in the relevant department and seek acknowledgement of receipt of same.
	iii) All guidance on the appropriate reporting to TUSLA of any and all disclosures by Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons to TII staff will be reported in accordance with TUSLA's child first training and/or in accordance with TUSLA's guidelines as outlined in their guide to reporting (link below).
	iv) Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons will not be left unsupervised.
	v) Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons will be asked to provide emergency contact details.
Risk of harm online to the young person in the course of their placement	<ul> <li>TII uses a website filtering system which categorises and blocks access to sensitive content from its network in accordance with TII's Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Acceptable Use Policy.</li> </ul>

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Harm is defined in the Children First Act as follows: "harm" means, in relation to a child— (a) assault, ill-treatment or neglect of the child in a manner that seriously affects or is likely to seriously affect the child's health, development or welfare, or (b) sexual abuse of the child, whether caused by a single act, omission or circumstance or a series or combination of acts, omissions or circumstances, or otherwise.

nn teland	ii) A training induction in relation to IT Acceptable Use Policy will be provided to the young person prior to use of IT systems.		
	iii) Any harmful material will be removed immediately from the young person's computer.		
	<ul><li>iv) The young person will be supervised at all times during his/her placement.</li></ul>		
That the nature of the work in the course of their placement may be inappropriate and potentially harmful	i) In determining placements of Transition Year secondary school student and other young persons, care will be taken to avoid placing students in units where exposure to the content of the work may be inappropriate for children. Where they are required to go 'on site' i.e. an area which is outside of normal public access, an individual risk assessment will be carried out by TII Health & Safety and Safe Pass training arranged at the expense of TII where required.		
	ii) Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons are not to be allowed in fleet vehicles or in any staff member's personal vehicle. Any work placement related travel in the duration of their placement will be undertaken via public transport and/or other publicly accessible routes.		
	iii) Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons wil never work more than [37 hours] a week and will receive an hour lunch break each day.		
	<ul> <li>iv) Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons will not be invited to any work related social events outside of working hou and/or off TII property.</li> </ul>		
Risk of harm or concern not being recognised or reported	<ul> <li>At least one relevant member of the department to which the Transition Year secondary school student or other young person is assigned will have completed the Children First eLearning training provided by TUSLA.</li> </ul>		
	ii) HR, in advance of the placement, will distribute the TII Child Safeguarding Statement to all staff in the relevant department and seek acknowledgement of receipt of same.		
	iii) All guidance on the appropriate reporting to TUSLA of any and all disclosures by Transition Year secondary school students and other young persons to TII staff will be reported in accordance with TUSLA's child first training and/or in accordance with TUSLA's guidelines as outlined in their guide to reporting (link below).
