

Note

The following summary Table, produced daily, provides traffic trend information derived from a small sample set of traffic counters located on the national road network.

The information below covers the morning period from 7am until 10am. The trend for car traffic from this period of the day generally correlates closely with the overall daily trend in car traffic at each location.

Introductory Remarks

- Traffic figures are measured from 7am to 10am so as to provide an early indicator each day.
- Weekly heavy goods vehicle traffic has remained largely stable and accordingly the daily figures provided are for cars only.
- The changes recorded day-to-day are not cumulative – they compare only the current day's figures versus the same day in the previous week and the same day last year.
- **Level 5 restriction came into effect on Wednesday 7th October 2020.**

Daily Data for Thursday 7th October

- Traffic was impacted on M50, M1 and M4 this morning due to two incidents, one just after the M1/M50 roundabout blocking the right and middle lanes and the other after J7 Lucan blocking the right lane, J4 Ballymun to J7.
- Overall, this morning's traffic volumes show a decrease as compared to those one week previous, Thursday 30th September 2021, and a substantial increase as compared to Traffic volumes as compared to the same day in 2020.
- Car traffic just south of the Northern Ireland Border on the N1 at Jonesboro shows no change as compared with Thursday 30th September and a +32% increase as compared to the same day in 2020.
- In the case of the non-motorway border counter sites, traffic volumes today show changes of between -5% and +3% as compared with Thursday 30th September. The changes in car traffic volumes since the same day in 2020 ranges from -34% on the N16 west of Manorhamilton to +25% on the N2 north of Monaghan. It should be noted that traffic volumes at the N2, N3, N14, N15 and N16 counters are lower than at the motorway traffic counters and are likely to display wider fluctuations in traffic figures than other traffic counters.
- Traffic volumes on the radial routes into Dublin, comparisons with Thursday 30th September are as follows: -4% on the M1 at M50 to Airport, -3% on the N7 at Citywest, +1% on the M11 at Bray and -2% on the M4 at Celbridge-Maynooth. Comparisons with the same day in 2020 are as follows: +19% on the M1 at M50 to Airport, +35% on the M11 at Bray, +34% on the M4 at Celbridge-Maynooth, and +24% on the N7 at Citywest.
- The M50 (N3 Navan Road to N4 Galway Road) shows a -12% decrease as compared with Thursday 30th September, this reduction is likely due to traffic incidents, and a +13% increase as compared with the same day in 2020.
- In the case of the regional cities the changes in car traffic volumes this morning as compared with Thursday 30th September are as follows: N6 Bóthar na dTreabh Galway -1%, N40 Corks -1%, M9 Waterford -1%, and M7 Limerick +4%. Comparisons with the same day 2020 are as follows: N6 Bóthar na dTreabh Galway +8%, N40 Cork +10%, M9 Waterford +25% and M7 Limerick +26%.
