

# Taking the time out of your journey

The 39km long M4 / M6 Kilcock - Kinnegad Motorway Scheme will open on Monday 12th December 2005, almost one year ahead of schedule.

This new motorway will link the existing M4 Motorway at Kilcock to the N4 and N6 national primary routes at Kinnegad and will mean safer journeys and quicker journey times for all road users on these busy routes between Dublin and the Midlands, the West and the Northwest. There will be interchanges at Kilcock, Enfield and Kinnegad, for motorists to enter and exit the motorway.

The new motorway has been built through a public private partnership (PPP) agreement between EuroLink and the National Roads Authority and will be tolled to finance the cost of construction and maintenance.

## Tolling Lanes

There are nine toll lanes in each direction at the main toll plaza, located near Kilcock. There are also two toll ramps at the Enfield Interchange with two lanes in each.

The high number of tolling lanes is to prevent any queues on the new motorway.

## Get in Lane

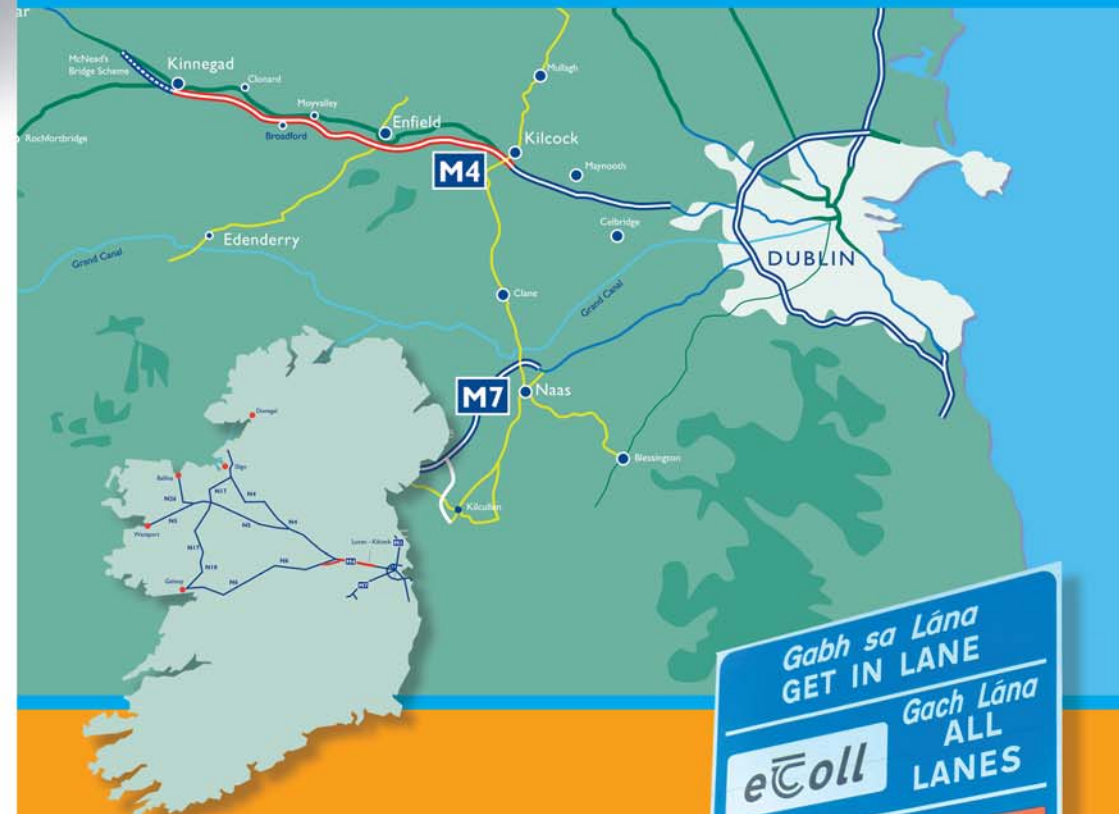
Follow the signs carefully so that you pass through the plaza with minimum delay.



### Get in lane

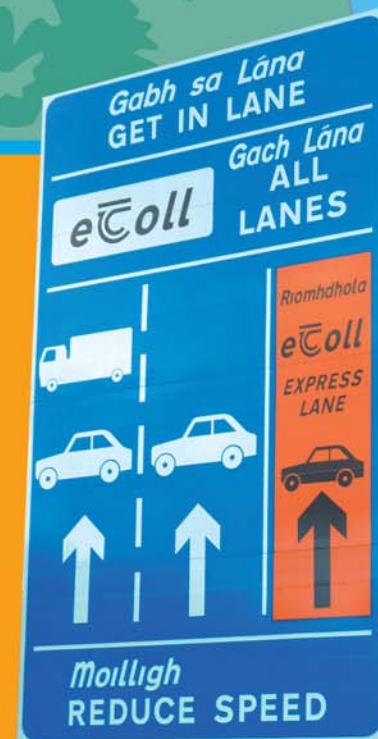
- ① Automatic: Credit Card accepted.

# Getting you there safely...

## Tolls

The following tolling costs were approved by the National Roads Authority in the Tolling Bye-Laws, published on 10th November 2005 and include VAT @ 21%.

## Payment

Tolls on the M4 can be paid by:

- Cash – Euros, Sterling and US Dollars
- Credit Cards
- EuroLink 20-trip Pre-Payment Cards
- Eirtag
- Other companies' electronic toll collection tags (operational date for this will be confirmed shortly)



## Cash

Cash payments can be made at manual lanes and at semi-automatic coin machines (baskets). In addition, one lane in each toll ramp will automatically give back change.

## Credit Cards

EuroLink will reach agreements with some of the principal credit card companies whose cards can be used at manual and semi-automatic toll lanes on the M4.

## EuroLink Pre-Payment Cards

Road users can purchase EuroLink Pre-paid cards for 20 journeys at a discount of 10%, i.e. 20 journeys for the price of 18. Customers can buy and top-up pre-paid cards at EuroLink's commercial office using cash or credit cards.

## Eirtag

EuroLink will issue its own Electronic Toll Collection Tags whereby customers agree to allow EuroLink to collect charges for journeys made from their credit card.

## Other Companies' Tags

Vehicles with other PPP companies' tags can pass through the Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) lanes on the M4. The exact operational date for this will be confirmed shortly. A short period of time for inter-plaza testing needs to be allowed for.

## Important Information for Local Road Users

- The existing N4 will be renamed as R-401 and will remain open and toll-free for local traffic and anybody else who wishes to use it.

## Re-entering the Motorway

Travelling between Dublin and the West – drivers who leave the motorway for a stop-over in Enfield will only pay once, if they continue their journey in the same direction within 3 hours. Remember to request a free re-entry ticket from the cashier.

The tag can only be used for the declared associated vehicle class.

The Eirtag will also be valid on other existing and future tolled roads in Ireland.
